A NOTE FROM THE PLAYWRIGHT, EMILY J. DALY

Hello! My name is Emily. I'm the playwright. I like your outfit, that's a great color on you.

Notes can be handy things to put in theater programs, because through them a writer can point out or contextualize something that you are about to see. Or perhaps entertain you while you sit and glance around the theater to game out if you still have time to run to the bathroom (I bet you do - go for it.)

I would like to use this note to share an excerpt with you. I have put this excerpt, in various incarnations, at the top of every new draft of this play, because I think it's important that we read it.

It's by Neta C. Crawford of The Watson Institute for International and Public Affairs at Brown University, from her 2018 article ""Human Cost of the Post-9/11 Wars: Lethality and the Need for Transparency":

"All told, between 480,000 and 507,000 people have been killed in the United States' post-9/11 wars in Iraq, Afghanistan, and Pakistan. This tally of the counts and estimates of direct deaths caused by war violence does not include the more than 500,000 deaths from the war in Syria, raging since 2011, which the US joined in August 2014.

[...] This tally is an incomplete estimate of the human toll of killing in these wars.

[...] In addition, this tally does not include "indirect deaths.' Indirect harm occurs when wars' destruction leads to long term, 'indirect,' consequences for people's health in war zones, for example because of loss of access to food, water, health facilities, electricity or other infrastructure."
