CLUTCH PRODUCTIONS is a nonprofit 501(c)(3) organization dedicated to creating opportunities for emerging female artists in theatre and film. By commissioning and producing original works, Clutch provides vital creative space for female writers, directors, actors, and designers to collaborate.

In 12-month cycles, Clutch fosters new, full-length plays from blank page to their world premiere on a New York stage. The commissioned play must feature a narrative driven from a woman's point of view and at least 50% of the roles in each play must be for actors identifying as women. The inaugural new play commission was the world premiere of *Every Good Girl Deserves Fun* by Heidi Armbruster (*Dairyland*, *Mrs. Christie*). It had a successful three-week run in December 2015 at Walkerspace. *The Worth of Water* commission began in May 2018.

Additional productions include **Bullet Catchers** by the Women in Combat Theatre Project at Judson Memorial Church, and the annual **empowHER Reading Series** that features original one-act plays and short screenplays by emerging female writers. www.clutchproductions.org
