

Kaso Jogi:

Founder, playwright, and director Saori Aoki has brought her theatrical talents to 20 countries, including twice to New York City as director of Hanafuda Denki (written by Shuji Terayama), which was written up in the New York Times and the Wall Street Journal.

Launched in 2016, Kaso Jogi is made up of skilled, experienced professionals who have come together to bring their talents to the world stage. The team is made up of a composer, translator, dancer, videographer, designer, musician, and many actors. So far the troupe has travelled to Scotland twice and done an elementary school tour in Japan. In 2020, Kaso Jogi will go to University of New Hampshire to direct theatre students in staging "The Gate" which will be performed in late February 2020.
