Produced by HERE and presented by La MaMa, CANNABIS! A VIPER VAUDEVILLE is a theatrical concert is exploring the history of cannabis using music, dance, and spoken word grounded in the Hip Hop tradition of the remix and mashup.

The team includes Grace Galu as composer/performer/music director, Baba Israel as writer/performer/co-director. Talvin Wilks as dramaturg/co-director, and Nic Benacerraf as environment designer/associate director, in collaboration with hip hop and spoken word collective, Soul Inscribed including Robert Knowles, Sean Nowell, Juan Carlos Polo, Osei Kweku, and Jonathan "Duv" Zaragoza and an ensemble of dancers that includes members of the revolutionary Urban Bush Women – Courtney Cook, Chanon Judson and Mame Diarra (Samantha) Speis, dance sensation Tatiana Barber, and mesmerizing street dancer Twice Light. The design team includes Nic Benacerraf, David Bengali, Kate Fry, Asa Wember and Tuce Yasak. Stage management by Alex West.

Inspired by Martin A. Lee's book *Smoke Signals:* A *Social History of Marijuana*, CANNABIS! A VIPER VAUDEVILLE weaves the music of icons such as Bob Marley with the stories of grassroots activists Dennis Perron and Brownie Mary with personal narratives. From Congo Square to the speakeasies of the jazz age, from the revolutionary happenings of the '60s to the AIDS activism of the San Francisco buyers club, our time traveling tale invokes a tradition of rebel spaces — sites of music, healing, and resistance.

CANNABIS! A VIPER VAUDEVILLE was commissioned and developed in the HERE Artist Residency Program. It was originally planned to prremiere during HERE and BMP's Prototype Festival on January 7, 2022. Due to COVID, the 2022 Festival and our original run was postponed to now. We are thrilled to finally be premiering this work with La Mama.

# **LEAD ARTIST BIOS**

# GRACE GALU | CREATOR, COMPOSER, MUSIC DIRECTOR, SATIVA DIVA

is a vocalist, actor, guitarist and composer. She combines the sounds of her Irish and Congolese heritage and her LES upbringing in a soulful and gritty twist. Grace was featured in Buskerball, and recorded "Firelight" with Fearless Music. Her composition, "Ordinary Sentiment" was featured in the Ed Burns film, "Purple Violets" which premiered at the Tribeca Film Festival. Grace devised The Mendelssohn Electric with Trusty Sidekick, and was cast as the lead in their production, The Gospel Electric, commissioned by the Park Avenue Armory. She is a core member of the band Soul Inscribed, and was twice selected as a cultural ambassador for the American Music Abroad program. She has been selected as a cultural ambassador for their next residency program (2022). Grace is also a recipient of the NEFA NTP grant. Soul Inscribed has recently been signed to the music label, Tokyo Dawn and just released their EP, Tune UP. Grace is an artist in residence at HERE and the composer for Cannabis! A Viper Vaudeville. Grace voiced Wisdom in Nia Witherspoon's production, The Dark Girl Chronicles (2021 at The Shed).

# BABA ISRAEL | CREATOR, LIBRETTIST, CO-DIRECTOR, MAGICAL MYSTICAL MC (3MC)

is an artist, producer, educator, and consultant raised in New York by parents who were core members of the Living Theatre. He was Artistic Director of Contact Theatre in Manchester where he developed several festivals and productions. He was a resident artist at BRIC creating his latest multimedia performance *The Spinning Wheel* in collaboration with London-based company Unfinished Business. He is a core member of Hip Hop/Soul project Soul Inscribed, which recently completed the American Music Abroad program. He holds an MFA in Interdisciplinary Arts from Goddard College and is the CoArtistic Director of the Performance Project based at the University Settlement. He is a proud member of HERE's HARP program and is developing his current production, *Cannabis! A Viper Vaudeville*.

# TALVIN WILKS | CO-DIRECTOR

is a playwright, director and dramaturg based in Minneapolis and New York City. # NIC BENACERRAF | ENVIRONMENT DESIGNER & ASSOCIATE DIRECTOR

is a creative director, scenographer, and public scholar. He specializes in highly collaborative processes that incorporate design from the get-go. Nic was co-Artistic Director of The Assembly (Seagullmachine, HOME/SICK), and recently co-founded [[edge effect]], a transdisciplinary group that playfully deconstructs the techniques of mass persuasion in our everyday lives. His collaborators include Trusty Sidekick (Up & Away), The Living Theatre (Here We Are), Waterwell (GOODBAR), HERE (Looking At You), The New Wild (Everybody Is Gone), as well as arts/activist groups: The Brooklyn Commune, Calling Us In, and The Yes Men. Nic's learning communities include Wesleyan (BA), CalArts (MA/ MFA), and the CUNY Graduate Center, where he is a Mellon PublicsLab Fellow and is finishing a PhD in Theatre & Performance.

# PERFORMER BIOS

# TATIANA BARBER | CO-CHOREOGRAPHER & DANCER

is a young Black Woman originally from Los Angeles, CA. She began her dance training in Inglewood, CA under the direction of Ms. Kashmir Blake until age 6 then began training at the Debbie Allen Dance Academy until graduating Highschool in 2012. Soon after, she attended Dominican University of CA/ Alonzo King Lines Ballet where she achieved a BFA in Dance. After graduating in 2016, she spent a year in a professional dance company and completed her certification as a Classical Pilates instructor. Tatiana is now living in New York continuing to pursue her professional career on and off the stage. She is a multi-talented artist who has worked as a dancer, actress, choreographer, and creative director (music videos, tv series, movie scenes, etc). Some of her accomplishments include performing on The Metropolitan Opera stage, as a dancer, in the cast of Porgy & Bess choreographed by Camille Brown, and being awarded video of the month in Dance Magazine for her lead role in Tislarm Boule's Peggy Sue's Blues. At the beginning of 2020, Tatiana revamped the choreography for PRISM, an opera, to be performed at The Kennedy Center in DC which was postponed due to the Covid-19 pandemic. Since then she has launched a wellness brand and continues to work as a professional movement artist. All things movement are her life!

# COURTNEY COOK | CO-CHOREOGRAPHER & DANCER

A Virginia Native now residing in Brooklyn, NY. She began her formal movement and vocal development at family reunions and her home church. She is a graduate of the Virginia Governor's School of the Arts and holds a B.F.A in Dance and Choreography from Virginia Commonwealth University. She is now a company member and BOLD facilitator with Urban Bush Women, a company member with MBDance, and was a featured artist with Marguerite Hemmings (we free). She is honored to be a recipient of the 2018 "Bessie" Award for Outstanding Performance for her work with all three of these organizations. As a creator, she has had the privilege of performing her solo work, PoolPITT, as a featured artist in ModArts Dance Collective's Collective Thread '17, the Estrogenious Festival '17, curated by Maura Donohue, and BDAC's Creative Emancipation Collaboration, curated by Ebony Noelle Golden. She also has

been able to create in collaboration with interdisciplinary artists Tendayi Kuumba and Greg Purnell (UFlyMothership) exploring movement, sound, theater, and visual art.

# ROCKA JAMEZ | ADDITIONAL CHOREOGRAPHY

Born & raised in Crown Heights Brooklyn NY. Professional Dancer who specializes free form contemporary infused with the studies of KRUMP. He's also a designer in the fields of Urban Fashion & NYFW. Playing a big role as a Street Dance Community Leader, he created a Dance platform that unites all Dance Cultures, called "Roundz Of Flame". He participated in multiple NYFW events and achieved dance awards, features in The New York Times, VOGUE magazine and sponsorship by PUMA. Rocka was also honored to perform a dance piece for Rihanna at Parsons School Of Design | The New School Awards (2017) | with his brothers (Dance Trio) "The NUU Knynez". As a person who likes to inspire the children, Rocka taught dance to the youth abroad, in places like Bali, Indonesian, Africa, Sweden & Berlin, Germany just to name a few. His goal is to open Schools that specializes in all of the different street dance styles, fundamentals and history.

# CHANON JUDSON | CO-CHOREOGRAPHER & DANCER

has been growing with the acclaimed Urban Bush Women (UBW) since 2001, as performer and now Co-Artistic Director. She's a director's fellow with New Perspective Theatre and Chicago Director's Lab. Projects include *The Invention of Tragedy* (Flea Theatre), *It's Not so Bad in My Brain* (New Perspective Theatre), *Prometheus Bound* (The Tank), *Chronicle X* (The Shed), *Brett and Ashley* (New Perspective Theatre). Original projects include *Nurturing the Nurturer*, a performance ritual/gathering for mothers (Black Women's Blueprint) and *Family Arts* (FAM) - Alongside her husband they offer spaces for families to explore and create (*Bric, Bailey's Cafe, MS 35 Family Dynamics, Stoops*). Chanon has worked with Mickey Davidson, Kwame Ross, Barak adé Soleil, Talvin Wilks, Sita Frederick, Allyne Gartrell, and Sandra Burton. Performance credits include *A 24-Decade History of Popular Music* (Taylor Mac), *God's Trombone* (Craig Harris), *Cannabis* (Baba Israel), *Cotton Club Parade, Michael Jackson 30th Anniversary Concert*, and the Tony Award-winning musical *Fela!* 

# ROBERT KNOWLES | KEYS & MUSIC TRANSCRIPTION

is a multi-instrumentalist, improvisational musician ranging from piano, trumpet, and cello to beatboxing and electronic music production. He has worked on award-winning films and traveled the world with different musical acts including: GZA and members of The Wu-tang Clan, Soul Inscribed, Uglybraine, and his own project R0b0tr0n. The Staten Island native has built a career in the New York music community and is currently preparing a fusion project for 2020 with Jerome Jordan, Doron Lev, Sean Nowell, and Djibril Toure.

# OSEI KWEKU | BASS

is a Los Angeles born bassist, rapper and self diagnosed Keeper of the Funk. Having grown up in Los Angeles, oldies/throwback radio was staple in his life, so much of his major influence comes from the likes of Sly and the Family Stone, Parliament-Funkadelic, Curtis Mayfield, Sam Cooke, Aretha Franklin....you know

the rest. Kweku attended The New School for Jazz and Contemporary Music from 2012-15 and has since traveled the world as a freelance bass player. Playing on shows like Michael Jackson tribute shows *I Am King and Invincible*, Rennie Harris's *Funkedified*, Oya Festival in Norway, hosting a jam session in NYC and has made a couple on screen appearances in *Vinyl*, *The Irishman*, *The Only Living Boy in New York*.

# TWICE LIGHT | CO-CHOREOGRAPHER & DANCER

Twice Light was born in the Bronx and raised throughout Brooklyn. He is a founding member of dance trio, The Nuu Knynez. He has shared the Webster Hall stage with Michael Jackson and has performed on the Apollo Theater stage, winning 1st place at Amateur Night with The Nuu Knynez. His dance style is ELEMENTAL: Infusing The Elements Of Earth, Wind, Fire, Water. Through his craft, he hopes to inspire others in and out of the field to live the higher version of themselves in the skin they were born in. He aims to allow his dance to stay truthful to the source of light.

# SEAN NOWELL | SAXOPHONE/FLUTE

Originally from Alabama, Sean received a BA in Composition from Berklee College of Music in Jazz Composition and a MA from Manhattan School of Music in Performance. He has composed and improvised film scores, music for ballet and theatre, 20th century classical music, big band, and small jazz ensembles and has pushed the timbral boundaries of the saxophone by integrating electronic effects pedals. He has traveled and collaborated with dancers, actors, painters, stilt walkers, and acrobats on multiple international tours as Musical Director for Bond Street Theatre and has represented The Akbank Istanbul Jazz Festival as their Jazz on Campus Ambassador with the mission: convince college kids jazz is awesome. He also recorded with Stanley Clarke and George Duke for the movie Soul Men, co-wrote/improvised the score for the Nick Nolte movie Off the Black and has released the albums Firewerks, The Seeker, Stockholm Swingin' and The Kung-Fu Masters for Posi-Tone Records.

# JUAN CARLOS POLO | DRUMMER

is a Peruvian drummer, composer, and educator based in New York City. Since his arrival to the United States in December 2016, Juan Carlos has worked and collaborated with prominent musicians such as the multiple Grammy Awardwinner, pianist, and composer Arturo O'Farrill; tenor saxophonist Daniel Blake; acclaimed tap dancer and activist Ayodele Casel; cellist and composer Akua Dixon, and Hip-hop legend Grandmaster Caz. He holds a bachelor's degree in classical percussion from the National University of Music in Peru and a master's degree in Jazz Studies from The City University of New York. Juan Carlos chooses to let his music be influenced by his own experiences rather than to adhere to strict cultural tradition. His playing is an unconscious tendency grounded in multiple styles and regions. His music is thus an extension of his own life.

MAME DIARRA (SAMANTHA) SPEIS | CO-CHOREOGRAPHER & DANCER Mame Diarra (Samantha) Speis, Co-Artistic Director of Urban Bush Women, is a mother and movement improviser intrigued with rigor, risk, and experimentation. She has worked with Gesel Mason, The Dance Exchange, Jumatatu Poe, Deborah Hay (as part of the Sweet Day curated by Ralph Lemon at the MoMA),

Baba Israel, Marjani Forte, and Liz Lerman. Speis was the recipient of the Alvin Ailey New Directions Choreography Lab and was awarded a Bessie for Outstanding Performer. Her work has been featured at the Kennedy Center, Long Island University, Joyce SoHo, Hollins University, BAAD, Danspace Project, BAM, Dixon Place, BRIC, Dance Place, and The Kelly Strayhorn Theater. Speis has developed a teaching practice that explores pelvic mobility as the root of powerful locomotion and as a point of connection to the stories, experiences and lineages that reside in each of us. She has been a guest artist and teacher throughout the U.S., South America, Senegal, and Europe. Recent projects include *Walking with Trane* co-choreographed with Jawole Willa Jo Zollar and her collaboration with Chanon Judson-Johnson and Raelle Myrick-Hodges on *Hair and Other Stories*.

# JONATHAN "DUV" ZARAGOZA | VOCALS, TRICKSTER HIPSTER

is a soulful vocal artist from The Bronx. Known for his range in sound, his capacity to harmoniously collaborate with a variety of artists and genres of music, and his human beatboxing skills. You can find him regularly gracing stages in the NYC music scene at The Nuyorican, Arlene's Grocery, and The Bowery Poetry Club. Duv is continuing his seven-year long participation in the monthly performance series Symphonics Live as a headlining act. Duv has been a featured artist on world class stages such as Joe's Pub, BAM, The Brooklyn Museum, The Blue Note, The Apollo Theater, and Highline Ballroom. Duv leads workshops in vocal technique, use of modern music technology for the voice, songwriting, performance and beatboxing, always promoting creative thinking and leadership. He currently works with educational organizations Art Works, The Door, Urban Art Beat, Arts Horizons, and others in schools and hospitals in the New York area.

# KATE FRY | COSTUME DESIGN

Kate Fry is a costume designer and scenographer for stage, screen, and themed entertainment. Spanning across different media, recent productions include The Antelope Party (NY Times Critic's Pick), a music video for Mike Africa Jr. of HBO's documentary 40 Years a Prisoner, the Pulitzer Prize winning opera Angel's Bone (Poly Theatre, Beijing), a Neiman Marcus commercial featuring Rachel Brosnahan, and an immersive experience for Santander Bank at the Oculus in NYC that brought awareness of domestic violence to millions of pedestrians in the World Trade Center hub. As a scenographer, Fry designed both the set and costumes for The Wreck, an immersive, devised opera, hailed as "ingenious" by the Wall Street Journal. Fry was also scenographer on the dance film Coronation, for which she won multiple Scenic and Costume Design awards. Fry made her Broadway debut as Associate Costume Designer for Burn This (Hudson Theatre), and designed costumes for Rapper Tierra Whack's music video Mumbo Jumbo, which was Grammy Nominated for Music Video of the year. Fry's work has also been shown at BAM Harvey, The Public Theatre, NY City Center, Walt Disney Concert Hall, REDCAT, SF MOMA, Spoleto Opera Festival, Alabama Shakespeare Festival, The Sydney Festival, Divine Comedy Festival Poland, Prague Quadrennial, Tribeca Film Festival, and the Venice Film Festival. 
