Jacinta Yelland (Performer/Creator) is an Australian theatre performer and creator based in Philadelphia, USA. Jacinta has collaborated with companies across Australia and America including David Gordon, Quintessence Theatre Group, Philadelphia Asian Performing Artists, Philadelphia Artists' Collective, Tribe of Fools, and Visual Expressions. She holds a Master of Fine Arts in Devised Performance from The University of the Arts led by award-winning Pig Iron Theatre Company and was supported by Arts Queensland to study at École Philippe Gaulier, Paris. Her projects have been supported by Australia Council for the Arts, Arts Queensland, Network of Ensemble Theaters, and American Australian Association.

We believe in ensemble, exactitude, and exhaustion - pushing ourselves with every work we make. We seek to upend the conventional - exploring the hidden parts of ourselves to explode the taboos of our society. We are three women intent on making our voices heard.

The Choice serves as Chapter 1 of The Motherhood Project, a decade long series of performances by inFLUX Theatre Collective. The members of inFLUX, currently ages 26, 30 and 36, are facing down the decade in which their reproductive choices become more important, more scrutinized, and more impactful. In response to these pressures, the company came together to create The Motherhood Project where they will create five live performances over the next decade exploring their evolving relationship to motherhood.
