About the Cast!

Peekaboo Pointe: performance artist, stripper, burlesque performer and choreographer. She began performing in nightclubs in 2003 and has created a body of work that can coexist in both traditional performance spaces and the world of nightlife entertainment. She received an MFA in Performance and Interactive Media Art from Brooklyn College and a BFA in Dance from George Mason University. She has performed all over the world including Australia, China, Russia, across Europe and South Africa. In NYC she currently holds residencies at Duane Park and Slipper Room. She choreographed and performed for Taylor Mac's 24 Decades of Popular Music, and was a dancer for Gesel Mason Performance Projects piece Antithesis. She is currently creating interdisciplinary performance in NYC, and has presented work at HERE Arts, Dixon Place and Wild Project.

Alyssa Kitt Hanley: Fierce.

Formidable. The Feminist Fatale. Alyssa (she/her) is an internationally acclaimed powerhouse of burlesque from Sydney, Australia. An artistic and intellectual chameleon, Alyssa is a hybrid academic, erotic dancer and physical dramaturg, currently undertaking her PhD in Theatre and Performance Studies at City University New York. She is a graduate teaching fellow at Brooklyn College, the Director of the Australian Burlesque Museum, and Associate Producer of Mx Burlesque Australia. She has twice competed for Queen of Burlesque at the Burlesque Hall of Fame.

immigrated from Sao Paulo,
Brazil to New York in 2015.
Embraced by the nightlife
community, they have
joined stages in bars, dance
clubs, theaters and strip
clubs both as a performer
and a producer. Inspired by
their love of drag, dance

queer person.

As a trained dancer and avid lover of music and all things vintage, burlesque seemed like the best outlet for her to combine her wide range of interests into performance art! She aims to explore and share her deep passion for music and movement through the creative freedom that burlesque gives her.

Geo: (they/them) With a background in vocal performance, communication, and gender, has spent most of their career floating around a broad artistic spectrum. From performing as a classical church singing, comedian stripper, to a jazz singing DJ and producer, they feel the most complete when holding space for paradox. Sex work has helped heal their complicated relationship to performance and music, and they hope to ignite that feeling in Yes, Please.

multidisciplinary artist known to the Adult entertainment industry as "Miss Juliette." She is a professional dominatrix, Fetish film star, Wrestler & founder of "The Army of Self"-- a self-defense empowerment program of outreach & training primarily for sex workers & adult entertainers.
