# A NOTE FROM THE PLAYWRIGHT

In 1952, when Christine Jorgensen returned from Denmark following her gender reassignment surgery (back then it was called a "sex-change operation"), she became the world's first internationally recognized transgender celebrity. Poised, articulate and beautiful, she captured the public's imagination as she navigated her way through a firestorm of sensational headlines and newspaper stories. Americans in the repressed and repressive 1950s had never encountered anyone like her, and their ongoing fascination led to Christine's notable public career as a performer, best-selling author, college lecturer and tireless spokesperson for transfolk the world over. She did this with dignity, charm, unflinching honesty and disarming humor. Christine occupies a unique niche in our collective cultural history and ongoing conversations about gender and identity. She didn't start the sexual revolution, but as she once said, she helped give it a swift kick in the pants. As we approach her centenary in 2026, Christine's story, her accomplishments, and her legacy remain as timely as they were back in 1952 when she stepped off that SAS plane at Idlewild (now JFK Airport) and walked straight into the pages of history.

Everyone involved with this show through its various incarnations has been extraordinarily generous with their time and talents, and I would like to extend my thanks to all of them. A special shoutout goes to our producer Andy Hamingson for his unwavering enthusiasm and professional guidance; to the extraordinary Mark Nadler, who has been on board as Myles since the very beginning; to our brilliant director Michael Barakiva; and to Jesse James Keitel, who has brought so much depth and understanding to the role of Christine. Thanks are also due to the National Arts Club, where we had the first staged reading of *The Christine Jorgensen Show*; the Fresh Fruit Festival, where we had our first performances; to 59e59 Theaters for hosting our world premiere, and to the multitalented crew of theatre artists who have helped to bring this labor of love to such rich, joyous life.



**DONALD STEVEN OLSON** (Playwright and Co-Composer, he/him) has an international career as a playwright, novelist, and travel and garden writer. His plays have been seen in New York, London, Rome, Amsterdam, Pittsburgh, and Portland, Oregon, as well as on a number of virtual stages. The Christine Jorgensen Show had its first staged reading at the National Arts Club in New York, followed by performances at the Fresh Fruit Festival in Lower Manhattan and a world-premiere production at 59E59 Theaters in February 2024. Oscar & Walt, Donald's play about the 1882 meeting of literary lions Oscar Wilde and Walt Whitman, won the 2019 Best Full-Length Play award from ALAP/City of West Hollywood and received its world premiere in Rome. In 2021 it became the most-watched play in the New Works Virtual Festival to benefit the Actors Fund, received a critically acclaimed Kinetic Theatre Company production in Pittsburgh, and was livestreamed from Indiana University Bloomington by Playzoomers. London-based Joffre Books recently reissued e-book editions of three of Donald's groundbreaking novels and his collection of ghost stories. His rom-coms, written as Swan Adamson, were internationally published and translated. Over the years, Donald has written dozens of travel stories and guides to destinations in Europe and North America and authored two acclaimed guides to west coast gardens. www.donaldstevenolson.com
