# LAND ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

HERE Arts Center acknowledges that the land beneath us, this place, this community, owes its vitality to generations who have come before. # ABOUT DREAM MUSIC PUPPETRY

One of few programs in the country to grow and commission contemporary, adult puppet works, Dream Music provides performance opportunities to puppet artists, and encourages multidisciplinary collaboration to develop new puppetry techniques. This program was inaugurated with the premiere of Basil Twist's OBIE-award-winning *Symphonie Fantastique* in 1998. Under the artistic direction of Twist, and produced by HERE cofounder Barbara Busackino, the Dream Music aesthetic is geared toward puppet works that feature live music as a collaborative element.

Puppetry is the original multi-disciplinary art form therefore Dream Music artists if they so choose, have a place in the HARP program to develop their work alongside artists of other disciplines. Dream Music curates regular Puppetry Parlors to showcase excerpts from developing works both from within Dream Music and the puppetry community at large. Each year, Dream Music commissions new full-length puppet works; develops new puppet works by emerging puppet artists through Puppetry Parlors and at CULTUREMART; provides educational outreach through its partnership commissions for the legendary Village Halloween Parade; and offers national and international touring/presenting opportunities. Touring commissions include Lake Simons' What's Inside the Egg?, Kevin Augustine's Animal, Erin Orr's Savage Nursery, and Erik Sanko's The Fortune Teller.

The program is principally centered around the intimate Dorothy B. Williams Theatre, specifically configured for puppet works. Puppetry is a unique art form which takes many roots, and so our methods for crafting the program change with each artist who passes through our doors. Displayed outside of the Dorothy B. Williams Theatre is the Griff Williams Marionette Collection.

### **BIOGRAPHIES**

**Ash Winkfield** (xe/xem/xyr) is a multi-disciplinary artist working primarily in theater and the puppetry arts. Winkfield specializes in new and devised work presented in New York City, and has toured domestically and internationally with Basil Twist (Rite of Spring, Sister's Follies, Book of Mountains and Seas), The Walk with Little Amal (NYC, Toronto, US Tour), and most recently Yaa Samar Dance Theater's world premiere of "Gathering". Winkfield is passionate about creating work that speaks to the emotional experience of humanity in the face of injustice.

Alva Rogers, the Artistic Director of ALVA PUPPET THEATER, is a dramatist, puppeteer, and multidisciplinary artist. The company's most recent work, Topsy-Turvy, was presented at The 2024 Brooklyn Academy of Music's Gala at the request of Creative Trailblazer honoree, Solange Knowles and The Museum of Modern Art in 2023. Her work with Rodeo Caledonia High Fidelity Performance Theater ignited an early career as a performance artist and film actor (School Daze, Daughters of the Dust). Later, she concentrated more on writing, earning MFAs in Musical Theatre Writing (NYU/Tisch) and Playwriting (Brown); she also holds an MAT in History (Bard).

Bruce Monroe, a Dramatists Guild member, has been writing music and lyrics for Alva Rogers since they first met at NYU's Musical Theatre Writing Program (including the musicals Sunday, Mermaid, and nightbathing) as well as the score for the puppet play/installation Topsy Turvy at MOMA (2023). A Seattle-based composer, lyricist, librettist, orchestrator, dance arranger, music director, and conductor, his Northwest projects include Opera commissions, (Surfer, a comic book odyssey, Command Performance), independent film scores (credits on imdb.com) and audio series scores, for John Longenbaugh's Battleground Productions (most recently

Moonlight and Love Songs). Special Thanks, as always, to the engineering prowess of Dave Pascal. Bruce is married to Seattle Times Arts Writer, and novelist, Moira Macdonald (Storybook Ending).

Charlotte Lily Gaspard "Part celestial creature, part sophisticated human" is how Charlotte Lily Gaspard has been described by Faerie Magazine when contemplating the ethereal artist and her work in one of their features. Shadow puppet artist, educator, entertainer, and "bona fide fairy princess" (DUMBO Living), Charlotte's mission is to activate imaginations and celebrate playfulness wherever she goes.

Charlotte is the founder, artistic director and "fanciful mastermind" (Broadway World) behind Midnight Radio Show, a shadow puppet sci-fi fairytale theater company based in Brooklyn, NYC. Charlotte and her collective are known for devising innovative avant-garde enchantments, infused with puppets, poetry, music and dance, for the stage and beyond.

**Marcella Murray** is a New York-based theater artist from Augusta, Georgia. She is a playwright, performer, collaborator, and puppeteer. Murray's work is heavily inspired by the observed ways in which people tend to segregate and reconnect.

Along with David Neumann and Tei Blow, Murray recently co-created Distances Smaller Than This Are Not Confirmed (Obie Special Citation 2020) and Primer for an Impossible Conversation, a digital theater piece which premiered in 2021 at MCA Chicago. They recently premiered the Southern Futures commissioned Rich with History at UNC Chapel Hill's Center for Performing Arts. Murray is a co-curator of the Object Movement Puppetry Residency. She has been an Artist in Residence at LaMaMa

ETC as well as a participant in the EiO Writer's Room. She is a guest professor of theatre at Sarah Lawrence College.

Mecca Akbar has starred in off-Broadway productions of Pinocchio with New York Children's Theatre, Tree Haus with the New York Drama Company, as well as the original cast of Sesame Street: The Musical with Rockefeller Productions. She trained at New York Conservatory for Dramatic Arts in Chelsea Manhattan, as well as the British Academy for Dramatic Arts' Midsummer Shakespeare program at Oxford University. Mecca is a rotating marionettist at the Swedish Marionette Theatre in Central Park as well as teaches seasonal puppetry residencies for Lower Manhattan Arts Academy high school. Akbar is also a traveling Product Specialist with Toyota. Fall of 2025 Akbar will rejoin Concrete Temples PACKRAT at the Festival Mondial Desthéâtres de marionettes in Charleville-Mézzières. France.

**Thalya I. David** (she/her)is a Haitian-American actress from Florida with a BA in Fine Arts at Broward College. She moved to New York(2017) to continue to pursue an acting career and received her BFA in Acting at Marymount Manhattan College(2020). Performed on stage here and there, she debut as a puppeteer in Maria Camia's Healing Shipment at La MaMa Puppet Festival (2022 & 2023). She has the pleasure to work with Alva Roger's Doll's Palace at Dixon Place (2023 & 2024). William PK Carter is a quilter and puppet artist based in Central Valley, New York. They bridge the puppet and fine art worlds by fabricating wondrous creatures that exist at the intersection of queerness and blackness. They received their Bachelor of Science in Studio Art from Skidmore College in 2023, and their work has been exhibited and performed in theaters, galleries, and museums across the east coast. Puppet Showplace Theater (Brookline, MA), La Mama Experimental Theatre Club (New York, NY), Dixon Place (New York, NY), The Old Stone House of Brooklyn (Brooklyn, NY), The Ritz Theatre (Newburgh, NY), and The Frances Young Tang Teaching Museum and Art Gallery (Saratoga Springs, NY). Carter is the recipient of Skidmore College's President's Racial Justice Award (2021), the Van Dewater Memorial Award (2022), and the John P. Heins Award: Outstanding Senior Thesis Exhibition (2023). The world premiere of a puppetry show that traces the true events surrounding the arrival of a one-horned rhinoceros to Renaissance Europe, sparking an obsession that continued for hundreds of years. Through acts of hunting and collecting, Shivak's life size rhino puppet transforms in front of our eyes from a natural inspiring wonder to an object of human greed. Shivak and company hail from Chicago where this show was created with support from The Chicago International Puppetry Festival and this mark's their New York Debut.

### **BIOGRAPHIES**

KT Shivak is a builder, puppet designer, and puppeteer working in Chicago. Her puppets have appeared in the Chicago International Puppetry Festival, the New York Times, Puppetry International, the Chicago Tribune, and at the Chicago Cultural Center. As one of the first members of the Chicago Puppet Studio she has designed for numerous theater and film productions including Jeff Award winning The Steadfast Tin Soldier (Lookingglass Theater), Jeff Award nominated Pinocchio (House Theater), and Vancouver (Ma-Yi Theater Company). Her works "Rhynoceron" and "Derelict Devils" have been supported by DCASE grants and residencies at High Concept Labs, the National Puppetry Conference, and the Chicago International Puppet Theater Festival. She studied sculpture and performance at The School of the Art Institute of Chicago, where a love for wood carving and simple machines led her to start working for a puppet theater for the first time. www.ktshivak.com

**Ben Zucker** uses music to speculate on the systems and shapes of change, which has led to a wide-ranging career as a composer, multi-instrumentalist improviser, producer, and cultural worker, with contributions to experimental scenes across North America and Europe. Acclaimed as a "master of improvisation" (IMPOSE Magazine), and "more than a little bit remarkable" (Free Jazz Blog), his work includes "stirring compositions...built on a lifetime of musical curiosity" (Chicago Reader), and performances on vibraphone, brass, keys, voice, and electronics across styles. This intentionally diverse, constantly engaged practice has included highlights such as compositions featured at the Berlin Philharmonie, London Roundhouse, and in PBS documentaries, residencies with OneBeat and the Stockholm EMS, and collaborations with groundbreaking musical figures ranging from Anthony Braxton to Sudan Archives. They live in Chicago, working as a freelance musician, lecturer at Roosevelt University, President of New Music Chicago, and curator for Elastic

**Jacky Kelsey** is a nonbinary soft sculptor, costume designer, and puppeteer based in Chicago. Their work deals with themes of body, comfort, neurodivergence, and queer identity. Motivated by a belief that play is necessary for life, Jacky treats the multimedia collaborative potential of puppetry as a playground.

Their puppets were recently shown at the Chicago Cultural Center's 2025 "Potential Energy" exhibition. In 2022 they were granted an Artist in Residency position at the Chicago Puppet Studio, during which they designed sculptural dance costumes for Hedwig Dance's \*META | MOR | PHOS\* in collaboration with Bauhaus Dessau. In 2023 they created \*Fidget,\* a surreal show about giant restless hands, in participation with the Chicago Puppet Studio's eight month Puppet Lab workshop. They designed and performed for \*Little Fears\* as part of Steppenwolf's 2025 Lookout Project. They remain active in the local physical theater and puppetry scene, working with theaters such as Roughhouse, Manual Cinema, and Steppenwolf.

**Chih-Jou Cheng** is a Taiwanese physical theatre creator. movement artist, and puppeteer currently based in Chicago. She has performed in productions such as The Dream King (Teatro Vista), The King and I (Drury Lane), and A Chorus Line (Metropolis), also worked with Chicago Shakespeare Theater and Chicago Puppet Studio. Her recent works, including "Above the Water," "Unfinished Island Songs," and "Arriving at Dawn," delve into themes of migration, identity, and healing, aiming to foster compassion and promote collective healing through innovative, interdisciplinary physical theatre. Her work has been supported by Chicago Cultural Center Dance Studio residencies, Ragdale residency, and DCASE. Variations on (the) Water is experimental by design. It breaks down puppetry to its most simple base, devoid of expected form and asks the viewer to imagine. Together, the audience and the performer bring forward image and story, giving equal energy to nurture a personal yet shared story. Empathy blossoms and through the abstracted imagery we find a shared story and experience. An exploration of Simons & Dyer's Raft Project (My Shapes Are In Turmoil) a full length wordless puppet theatre work.

### **BIOGRAPHIES**

**Lake Simons** is a Texas raised, Brooklyn based director, designer, puppeteer, and physical theatre performer. Her original theatre productions utilize movement, puppetry, and live music to create stylized visual storytelling for the stage. She is a believer in the childhood ability to play "make-believe" and her creations encourage the viewer, of any age, to rediscover their own ability to do so. Lake has collaborated with a multitude of musicians, performers. designers, and artists throughout her lengthy, 30 plus year, career. She has received seven Jim Henson Foundation grants in support of her original puppetry productions. Lake is the Managing Artistic Director of Hip Pocket Theatre in Ft Worth, TX. Her productions have been seen at HERE Arts Center, La MaMa. Dixon Place. One Arm Red, Miller Theatre, and Hip Pocket Theatre. Career highlights: Puppet Designer for Have You Met Jane Goodall and Her Mother? (Ensemble Studio Theatre). Associate Puppetry Director for Warhorse (Lincoln Center), Puppetry Coach for Wolf Play (MCC), and codirector for the Puppet Lab at St. Ann's Warehouse in Brooklyn, NY. Lake teaches puppetry at Sarah Lawrence College and is a teaching artist with Arts Connection in NYC. She is an alum of Ecole Jacques Lecog in Paris. France and North Carolina School of the Arts.

John Dyer is a musician, composer, songwriter, lyricist / librettist, theatre-maker, and visual artist based in New York City. Founder of Texas band Drama Tiki (1992-1998), Music director for North Carolina's Paperhand Puppet Intervention (1999-2001), half of roots duo Hawke & Owl (2008-2012), and Papa to Cy (2016-present). Solo albums include One Among (2000), Phantom Fire (2003), and GoStayPlay (2004). He is the recipient of multiple ASCAPlus Awards, Meet The Composer grants, and Dallas Fort Worth Theatre Critic's Forum Awards. Works produced by Culture Hub include music for puppeteer Tom Lee's The Return (2014), and Dyer's lyrical arrangement of a text by playwright Erik Ehn, 7 Wanders

To Hollow (2022). He appeared onstage in Hero's House (with Deana, Matt, and Esa Acheson) at Dixon Place's Puppet Blok (2016) and provided live musical accompaniment for the exhibition performance Richard Tuttle: What Is The Object? (2022). Scores for short film include Ben Elling and Rosa Douglas' Qualified Alien (2020), and Eric Wright's The Moon Is Cheese (2021). He provided music for playwright Johnny Simons' Up In Auntie's Attic (2003) and Sitting On The Lake (2024) and for choreographer Takemi Kitamura's Tsunami (2024). Dyer's theatrical co-creations with Lake Simons. presented at Hip Pocket Theatre, and in New York at St. Ann's Warehouse, HERE, and La MaMA, include Alice's Adventures in Wonderland (2003), White Elephant (2009), Wind Set-up (2011), Moby Dick (2012), Tree Pop (2015), Loop The Loop (2018), Arcadia Darling (2019), Pixie Posy (2021), When We Were Very Young (2022), and Raft Project (2024)

By providing these genre-blending artists with an adaptive, flexible home for developing and producing their work, we share a range of perspectives reflective of the complexity of our city. HERE welcomes curious audiences to witness groundbreaking performances, responsive to the world in which we live, at free and affordable prices.

Under the leadership of Co-Directors Jesse Cameron Alick, Annalisa Dias, Lanxing Fu, and Lauren Miller, HERE continues to evolve as a home for artists and audiences alike. Appointed by the Board in 2024, the Co-Directors collaboratively lead the artistic and executive functions of the organization, shaping its vision, programming, and community engagement.

HERE strives to create an equitable, diverse, and inclusive home in which all people have fair access to the resources they need to realize their visions. We acknowledge structural inequities that exclude individuals and communities from opportunities based on race, gender, disability, sexual orientation, class, age, and geography, and seek to counter those inequities in our work. HERE's work and artists have received 16 OBIE Awards, two OBIE Grants and a CUNY Booth Award for artistic achievement, two Berilla Kerr Awards, four NY Innovative Theatre Awards, two Bessie Awards, two Pulitzer Prizes, one Pulitzer nomination, six Drama Desk nominations, two MacArthur "Genius Grant" Fellowships and most recently, seven Tony nominations. HERE remains on "Best Off-Off Broadway" theatre lists across New York City. In 2005, with the support of the City of New York and the Lower Manhattan Development Corporation, HERE purchased its 9,000-square-foot longtime home with two performance spaces, a lounge, and gallery. With fullscale renovations completed in 2008 and 2011, thanks to significant support from the City of New York, HERE continues to stand as a pillar of the now burgeoning Hudson Square neighborhood.

HERE's core annual audience consists of approximately 30,000 20-40 somethings. We produce work that is affordable, challenging and alternative—offering our audiences the opportunity to feel that they are part of something new and fresh. Key elements of our performance programming are designed to allow the public to have as many access points to the development of original art as possible through work-in-progress showings, workshop productions, post-show artist talkbacks, informal discussions in our café and full productions.
