Loud and/or Sudden Noise

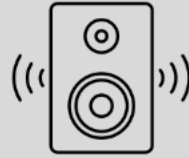
At times during the show, there will be loud noises which may be unexpected

Loud music and/or Bass

This show will contain loud music or bass elements. You may feel the vibration from these elements.



Flashing Lights


There will be portions of the show where lights will flash or a strobe effect will be used.



Sudden Changes in Lighting

At points during the show, the lights may become dim or brighten suddenly. There may be times when lights are pointed toward the audience momentarily and will appear very bright.

Intense Visuals

You may see bright colors, complex patterns or fast moving visuals/projections.



Intense Emotions

Some of the characters will show intense emotions like sadness, fear, anger and joy. You may see the actors crying, wailing or yelling to show what the character is feeling. This is all to help tell the story.



Arguments

At times the characters may argue with or yell at each other which is all part of the show.



Physical Fighting

Actors will engage in what looks like physical fighting to help tell the story, but this is not real and is all part of the show.



Offensive Language

The actors will use words that some people find offensive.
